

Literacy

This week we read the story "The Cow that Laid an Egg." It got us thinking about what was going to happen in the story (our prediction) and what helped us to form our prediction. If you look carefully at the front cover of the book, you can see the egg is black and white, just like Majorie the Cow from the story. We got to work creating and designing our own eggs so that our peers could guess what animal was going to come from our egg. Later in the week, we are going to write a description to go with our picture and include nouns, verbs and adjectives in our sentences.





Last week we went on a scavenger hunt to find two

and three digit numbers. Miss Douglas put sticky notes around the room that had the numbers

written on them and we had a table that had questions like "Find the number that is 10 more than 25."

Once we found the number, we wrote it down next to the question. We have been talking lots about one more and one less, ten more and ten less, and even 100 more and 100 less. We're getting pretty good at it.








Dear Parents and Guardians,


