






Grades Prep - 2pm and Grades 3-6 - 2.30pm

This week in P-2, the focus has been on pitch. In simple terms, pitch is how high or low a sound is. We began identifying different pitches by making animal sounds and deciding if they were high or low. Then we practised some vocal exploration by following lines with our voices. You can create lines to practise following the pitch by drawing them, or by making them with

Adapting to this new way of learning brings about a number of challenges. Having no access to instruments, or even fellow classmates to practise with, means the activities we do and games we play have to be changed to suit remote learning.

One of the hands-on circle games we love is 'Obo-she-oten-toten'. It's a group clapping song & game in which you go 'out' if your hand is clapped on a given number. This week online, we tried playing the game by clapping, clicking and tapping a specific rhythm, and if you clapped on a certain number, you were 'out'. We decided it worked pretty well, but was not as fun as the original game!





### **F-2**


